



- **#1** Hospitality room hours will be posted on the doors. Hospitality rooms are located on the ground floor off the hall to the right of the beach exit doors. Join your shipmates for drinks, snacks and memories.

The USS Sea Poacher Assn. has \$12,292.13 in the bank as of 11/10/05. However, we have written additional checks totaling \$3975.00 and have a true balance of \$8,317.13. Most of this additional expense is related to the upcoming reunion.

Hurricane Relief Fund

In response to our plea for donations to distribute among those Sea Poacher shipmates who were severely affected by hurricanes Katrina and Rita, we received \$3,470 from 49 donors. We conducted a search for shipmates that were living on the affected gulf coast and contacted them to determine their well-being and the extent of their loss.

From the information we gathered, we were able to narrow the list to five shipmates that needed assistance from the relief fund. It was decided early on that we would add money from the general fund to make each check a whole, round number. The general fund contributed \$155 to the relief effort to bring the total to \$3,625 and each needy shipmate was awarded a check in the amount of \$725. Four of the checks have been hand-delivered and the fifth is in the mail to a shipmate that relocated to Nebraska.

I spent a couple of hours with Marty and Enola Stokes yester-day afternoon. They are both well except from allergies brought on by all the dust in their neighborhood. Their house is a mess. They have discarded almost all of their furniture. The sheetrock has been removed up to four feet from the floor. They have no power because of shorts in some of their electrical outlets. The power company has them locked out until the problems are corrected. They had 9 inches of water throughout their house. Maybe you've read about the questionable evacuation of the drainage pump operators in Jefferson Parish. Well, that's what got them. Enola says it's a good thing Marty's guns are at the gunsmith right now. She's not a happy camper in that regard.

They'll be alright. It'll take time, lots of time.

I gave them a check from the Hurricane Relief Fund for \$725 and it brought them to tears. Choked me up to. They said they will be in touch soon. They just need some time on a computer some-

After Hurricane Katrina, several shipmates all had the same idea. That we should take up a collection for affected shipmates. Accordingly, the Association Officers set up a mechanism for collecting donations, finding those shipmates affected, and finally, disbursing the funds.

First, since our treasurer, Ken LeBlanc was in the affected area and intially not able to be contacted, it was decided that I would be able to disburse funds on an emergency basis in Ken's absence (I have a second set of checks).

Then Jack Merrill made up a special "SOS Shipmates In Distress" postcard to send to all shipmates that didn't have e-mail. In addition, I sent word out to all those shipmates with e-mail.

The appeal to shipmates to donate was outstanding. Many of those who donated had already donated to other relief organizations, but still sent a check for their USS Sea Poacher shipmates. We collected \$3,570 from 49 shipmates.

In addition, the Association paid \$116.68 for the postcards and \$55 as a donation to "round-up" the checks to 5 individuals to a "real number" of \$725 each.

The affected shipmates were:

- 1 Marty Stokes (Metraire, LA. He had nine inches of water in his home) He is temporarily living in another location in Metraire,
- 2. Eddie Montz (Metraire, LA. He had six inches of water in his home, extensive damage). He is temoprarily living in Ponchatoula, LA.
- 3. Harold Sander (Pascagoula, MS) He has moved to Imperial, NE.
- 4. Harold Swan (Gretna, LA. He had extensive damage). He is living in Harahan, LA now.
- 5. John Mazjun (Lost his home in Milton, FI due to Huricanes Ivan and Dennis in 2004)

6. - Rudolph Swensen, Pascagoula, MS

Although Harold Swan lost his home, he told us not to send him a check as he was well reimbursed by insurance, and relief agences and Catholic and Protestant relief societies.

The Association Officers decided to include John Mazjun in the Hurricane relief when we found out that his home was completely distroyed during Hurricanes Ivan and Dennis in 2004.

Shipmates, one big problem with an event like Hurricane Katrina is that we've had problems finding shipmates after the event is over. If you suffer damages in the future due to a large event such as a hurricane, please remember to contact any one of the Association Officers as to your damages and new address.

As you can see from Ken LeBlanc's column, we're still trying to find Harold Sander and Rudolph Swensen at this time. If you know their address, please contact us.

Ken LeBlakc is presently planning on visiting all the affected shipmates and delivering the checks on behalf of the USS Sea Poacher Association.



